Australasian Darter	C	Regularly seen on dam and billabongs
Australasian Grebe	O	Brangie Dam May 2019
Australian Magpie	R	Common throughout property
Australian Pelican	RM	Visits to fish when dam and lagoons low
Australian Raven	R	One or more pairs regularly seen
Australian Shelduck	O	Visit to nest in trees and feed on pasture
Australian Wood Duck	C	Common Brangie Dam
Azure Kingfisher	R	Can be seen along banks of river, creekline or dam
Barking Owl	R	Spotted in Forest of Hurdle Creek March 2020
Black-faced Cuckoo-shrike	C	Commonly seen foraging on caterpillars
Black-tailed Native-hen	O	Brangie Dam October 2019
Black Swan	O	Visits when dams and wetlands full
Brown Falcon	R	Seen perching on fences & dead trees on Brangie Dam
Brown Thornbill	R	Found amongst dense shrubbery creek, river & reveg
Brown Tree-creeper	R	Forages on logs along river and creek
Brown-headed Honeyeater	C	Often found in family groups in the Red Gum woodland
Brown Quail	RM	Found in sedges and grasses on the floodplain
Brown Songlark	RM	Hurdle Creek Billabong near Yurt November 2019
Chestnut Teal	O	Brangie Dam August 2019
Common Bronze Wing	R	Commonly found in regeneration block
Crested Pigeon	R	Throughout property
Crested Shrike-tit	R	Forages throughout the Red Gum woodland & Reveg
Crimson Rosella	R	Breeds on property in tree hollows
Dollarbird	RM	Can be seen during Sep-Apr most years, breeds on property
Dusky Woodswallow	RM	Can be seen during warmer months
Eastern Rosella	R	Breeds on property in tree hollows
Eastern Spinebill	C	Regularly seen near house and Yurt Aug 2019 in Almond Blossom
Eastern Whipbird	O	From riverine forests further up the catchment July 2019
Eastern Yellow Robin	R	Seen near the denser patches Red Gum woodland July 2019
Eurasian Coot	O	Seen on the waterways
European Starling	C	Common
European Blackbird	R	Common
Fairy Martins	R	Aug 2019 seen flocking along Hurdle Creek tree line
Fantail Cuckoo	RM	Usually seen throughout the cooler months
Flame Robin	RM	Seen on/adjacent open areas in cooler months Reveg Autumn-Spring
Freckled Duck	O	Brangie Dam stopover
Galah	R	Common
Gang Gang Cockatoo	RM	Mostly seen eating Hawthorn berries on floodplain
Golden Whistler	RM	Common in cooler months
Great Cormorant	C	Regularly seen basking or fishing in waterways
Great Egret	O	Seen wading in wetlands when depths suitable
Grey Fantail	R	Common throughout property
Grey Shrike-thrush	R	Common in woodland areas of property
Grey Teal	C	Regular seen on waterways Jul/Aug 2019 Brangie Dam
Hooded Robin	R	Woodland
House Sparrow	R	Common near house & sheds
Jacky Winter	C	Can be seen in open woodlands & at Brangie Dam
King Parrot	R	Breeds in tree hollows

Laughing Kookaburra	R	Common
Leaden Flycatcher	RM	Visits mostly in warmer months
Little Black Cormorant	C	Regularly seen basking or fishing in waterways
Little Eagle	O	Can be seen flying low amongst woodland canopy & on Brangie Dam
Little Friarbird	RM	Warm season migrant
Little Falcon (Hobby)	C	Often seen hunting amongst woodland canopy
Little Lorikeet	O	Occasional visitor
Little Pied Cormorant	C	Regularly seen basking or fishing in waterways. Brangie Dam Oct 2019
Little Raven	C	Common in small groups
Little Corella	C	Common
Magpie Lark	R	Common
Masked Lapwing	R	Common on cleared parts of property
Mistletoe Bird	O	Occasionally seen amongst mistletoe
Nankeen Kestrel	RM	Seen hunting in open parts of the property
Noisy Friarbird	RM	Warm season migrant
Olive-backed Oriole	RM	Mostly Warm season migrant
Pacific Black Duck	C	Common
Pied Butcher Bird	O	Heard in woodland May 2019
Pied Currawong	RM	Cool season migrant
Purple-crowned Lorikeet	O	Occasional visitor
Rainbow Bee-eater	RM	Warm season migrant
Red-browed Finch	R	Common
Red-capped Robin	C	Regularly seen in pairs
Red-rumped Parrot	R	Common
Red Wattlebird	C	Present most of the year
Restless Flycatcher	C	Present in low numbers amongst the woodland
Richard's Pipit	C	Often seen in open paddocks
Rufous Songlark	RM	Warm season migrant
Rufous Whistler	RM	Warm season migrant
Sacred Kingfisher	RM	Breeding Sep-Apr
Scarlet Robin	RM	Cool season migrant throughout woodland Reveg Autumn-Spring
Silvereye	C	Common
Spine-tailed Swift	O	Often seen flying overhead in stormy weather
Southern Boobook	C	Often calling in the woodland
Spotted Pardalote	C	Commonly heard amongst woodland trees
Straw-necked Ibis	RM	Common during wetter periods
Striated Pardalote	C	Common most times
Striated Thornbill	C	Often seen feeding in middle stratum of woodland
Sulphur-crested Cockatoo	R	Breeds on property in tree hollows
Superb Blue-wren	R	Common all over property
Tawny Frogmouth	R	Spotted at Yurt 2018
Tree Martin	C	Regularly seen hawking
Varied Sittella	O	Seen foraging amongst upper branches in woodland
Wedge-tail Eagle	C	Commonly seen flying overhead
Weebill	R	Common
Welcome Swallow	R	Common
Western Gerygone	RM	Commonly heard in warmer months
Whistling Kite	C	Common
White Ibis	C	Common
White-bellied Cuckoo-Shrike	O	Heard at time in the woodland
White-bellied Sea Eagle	RM	Seen in Brangie Dam trees & overhead flying along the valley
White-breasted Woodswallow	RM	Often seen above waterways in warmer months. Brangie Dam Sep '19
White-browed Scrubwren	R	Common amongst denser undergrowth
White-browed Woodswallow	O	May be seen in warmer months
